This quarter, we're honored to introduce Quen, a Case Manager with Transformative Reentry. She is a military wife and comes from a military family—her grandfather earned a Purple Heart for his service in the 101st Airborne Division. Quen holds the title of Ms. Armed Forces All American 2018, focusing on mental health awareness for military spouses.

Quen's diverse background includes roles as an art teacher, math interventionist, theatre teacher, certified nursing assistant in long-term care facilities, and a child abuse neglect worker committed to reunification efforts. She is a trained death doula and a member of Initiate Justice Action, the Humane Hospice Prison Project, and Kiwanis. Quen will start her Master of Public Leadership program in June.

Recently, Quen went above and beyond for one of our residents who was passing away. She sat vigil with him during his final moments, reading aloud and completing a word puzzle—something he loved. Her dedication in his last hours inspired us all.

Quen feels that she has come full circle. Her time working in social services and education has made her poignantly aware of the importance of public policies and reform. Her focus on growth and professional experiences has shaped her advocacy for positive change.

As this community knows, military life comes with unexpected changes, and Quen is unfortunately leaving VTC as she departs to join her husband in Washington, DC. Though her time with us has been short, Quen has made a lasting impact on the VTC family. We are profoundly grateful for her contributions and wish her all the best in her future endeavors.

The Lightfighter Village housing project is steadily progressing toward our goal of offering 70 units of Permanent Supportive Housing for low-income Veterans and their families by the beginning of 2025. With exterior construction nearing completion, our focus now shifts to the interior construction of each unit.

Earlier this year, VTC staff had the privilege of touring Lightfighter Village, where we caught our first glimpse of the housing complex's interior. A standout feature that filled us with anticipation for the future was the inclusion of balconies for every unit. Some fortunate residents will have the pleasure of breathtaking ocean views right from their new homes. This design element aims to offer more than just physical shelter; it strives to imbue a sense of tranquility and a deep connection to our stunning natural surroundings for those who have selflessly served our nation.

My name is Roy McKinley. Upon my suitability, I had already spoken with a past resident at VTC who recommended this program to me, and VTC came all the way down to Chuckwalla Valley Prison to pick me up. They took me to get steak and eggs, which was my first meal after so many years. You really need a support network after such a long time, and VTC was more than that; they were like family. They never let me become overwhelmed. There are people who have graduated from the same program who help us along. It's a wonderful community.

I'm moving into my own place now; I have a two-bedroom apartment. After 21 years, being able to take a bath was wonderful. As a former Lifer, I have parole plans and goals that I've set. I'm doing life coaching, and my goal is to start school again next fall. There's a beach down the street where I can go and just get some peace of mind and look at nature.
